COALITION MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Coalition membership will identify your house as healthy, safe, well managed and ethical. The San Bernardino County Coalition is a membership association for quality houses. Once you have met all the membership requirements, your house will be placed on the Sober Living Network referral services and a membership certificate will be issued. The following are the membership requirements.

Complete the application and assure that your house meets the requirements below:

1. Your sober living home is an alcohol and drug free environment.
2. Your sober living home only accepts and accommodates persons recovering from alcohol and/or drug addiction, with or without co-occurring mental health disorders.
3. Your sober living home requires applicants to commit to and remain involved in an active program of recovery of their design and choice.
4. Assure that all involved in the home operations complete the Sober Living Network Training.
5. Sign and abide by the coalition Code of Ethics.
6. Have a current general liability insurance coverage of \$500,000.00 minimum.
7. Attend coalition meetings regularly.
8. For site visits, please have your payment and all paperwork ready for the inspector. Failure to do so will result in an additional charge of \$35 per visit.
9. For your first home, new and renewing members prepare and submit the \$150.00 + \$60.00 legal defense fee payable to San Bernardino Sober Living Coalition.
10. Please prepare separate applications for each additional home and submit the \$50.00 fee.
11. Assure your sober living homes do not provide or require in-home services that meet the State Department Alcohol and Drug Program (ADP) alcohol & drug facility licensing requirements as stated in Chapter 5, Title 9, California Code of Regulations, Subchapter 1. Purpose and Definitions.

No one shall provide or require alcoholism or drug treatment services, which includes one or more or the following: detoxification, group sessions, individual sessions, educational sessions, and/or alcoholism or drug abuse recovery or treatment planning.
